Teacher Training

We are committed to our teaching staff participating in professional development and staying abreast of the current trends and research in early education.

- Several teachers are attending the 2018 "Together for Children" Conference on October 5th and 6th presented by the Georgia Association for the Education of Young Children (GAEYC). Sessions topics included: Literacy development, Anti-bias Curriculum, STEM and many others.
- On Monday, October 8th teachers will participate in state-approved professional development. The training topic will focus on supporting dual language learners in the classroom.
- Did you know that The Clifton School has a mentor teacher assigned to each village? Mentor teachers provide coaching and ongoing support to new teachers. We are excited to provide the opportunity for our mentor teachers to attend the 2018 National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) conference in Washington, DC. NAEYC's national conferences bring together early childhood educators teachers, program administrators, students, researchers and teacher educators to explore the latest research and learn from one another.

Flu Shots: Teachers and staff will be protected against the flu virus this season. Emory Healthcare will be providing free flu shots at both schools for all staff this month. The CDC recommends a yearly flu vaccine for everyone 6 months of age and older as the first and most important step in protecting against this serious disease.
