As we begin the new school year, we want to inform new families and remind continuing families that The Clifton School provides early intervention services.

## What is Early Intervention?

Early intervention is a system of services that helps infants, toddlers, and preschoolers with developmental concerns, delays, or disabilities. Early intervention focuses on helping eligible infants, toddlers, and preschoolers learn the basic and brand-new skills that typically develop during the first years of life, such as:

- physical (reaching, rolling, crawling, walking)
- cognitive (thinking, learning, solving problems)
- communication (talking, listening, understanding)
- social/emotional (playing, feeling secure and happy)
- self-help (eating, dressing)

# **Examples of strategies used in the classroom:**

- Schedule adjustments
- Visual schedules
- Oral motor supports
- Sensory materials added to the environment
- Technology added to support communication
- Visual timers
- Materials added to support development
- Teacher training

### **Examples of third-party connections for early intervention services:**

Assistive technology (devices a child might need)

- Audiology or hearing services
- Speech and language services
- Public school system services
- Counseling and training for a family
- Medical services
- Nutrition services
- Occupational therapy
- Physical therapy
- Psychological services

#### Home visits

In October, we will begin implementing home visits with some families. The teachers will select which families to visit based on the family's interests and the children's needs.

Home visits can establish positive interactions and communication with families. They are not a replacement for parent-teacher conferences but are a process through which teachers demonstrate their support for children's families by visiting the home environment or an alternative location where the family feels at home and comfortable, like a local library. Home visits promote proactive interactions and build good relationships.

## **Coaching Program**

The program provides coaching and support to novice teachers and leadership training and growth opportunities to experienced teachers. The coaches and protégés receive several hours of professional development and financial compensation for participating in the program. The coaches at our Clairmont site are Marilyn Ebron, Sahanta Favors, Lathea Wilder, and Audrea Jackson. The coaches at our Clifton Road site are Dana Rogers, Angela Curtis, Tiffany Wilburn, and Bernita Love.

### **Check-in Calls**

The administrative team is conducting check-in calls with families to learn about their experiences during the first month of the school year. We want to know what's going well for families and the areas where we can improve. We have randomly selected families to call. Not all families will receive a call.
